Headteacher's Message

Dear parents and carers,

Another exciting week has passed in school and we now only have 1 more week until we finish for half term. Time is absolutely flying!

This week is Christian Aid Week, and in our Monday whole-school worship we learnt about the fantastic work which this charity does. We looked at case studies of children in different parts of the world who are not able to go to school for a variety of reasons and children were asked to reflect on how lucky they are to be able to attend school daily and receive a good education.

In Wednesday's worship, children learnt about the benefits of walking to link in with National Walking Month. We are incredibly lucky to live in such a lovely part of the country and there are many walks around us which we can enjoy. On Thursday, children learnt about the ascension of Jesus into heaven and what this means for Christians today.

It is national 'Walk to School' week next week. Please consider walking to school as an alternative to driving if you possibly can. Your child has been given a leaflet to bring home to support the walk to school campaign.




He has been training hard over recent weeks and months to get ready for this. Please show your support to Charlie while he completes this mammoth challenge.
